Loving Our Children Like Jesus Loves Us

It is February and love is in the air, but how do we show our children the love of Jesus? It isn't through stuffed animals, chocolate hearts, or a bouquet of flowers. The best way we can teach our children to share the love of Jesus and to be a light is to help them to understand just how much Jesus loves them. Perhaps, that's why one of the first songs we teach our children is the song Jesus Loves Me. The song, written in 1860 by Anna Warner begins like this:

Jesus loves me, this I know For the Bible tells me so Little ones to Him belong They are weak but He is strong.

Children and adults alike feel great joy and comfort in the simple truth conveyed by this song. Once these words settle in our souls, we then carry this message in our hearts. We can learn much about loving children from Jesus, the author of our faith.

These Bible verses offer insight into why Jesus' relationship with children was so special and guide us in helping our children experience God's love.

Jesus made children a priority.

Even in the midst of his busy ministry, Jesus acknowledged and valued children as individuals and recognized the important role he played in their lives. No one had more to accomplish in life than Jesus; yet, he always made time to care for children.

"And they brought unto him also infants, that he would touch them: but when his disciples saw it, they rebuked them. But Jesus called them unto him, and said, suffer little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God"—Luke 18:15-17

Jesus blessed the little children.

Jesus received them. He publically praised them. He never let others diminish their worth.

"And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them and blessed them" – Mark 10:16

Jesus prayed for children.

Jesus was personally involved in the lives of children. He surveyed their spiritual needs, placed His hands upon them, and prayed for them.

But Jesus said, "Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven" Matthew 19:14

Jesus reached out to children in all types of situations.

As we teach our children how to positively relate to others we are sharing the love of Jesus. Our care of others is a measure of greatness. We are called to embrace those who may not be able to return our care and concern; the needy, the helpless, the poor. We can reach out to children in need and help them feel loved and accepted. Jesus teaches us this.

Luke 9:47-48: "And Jesus, perceiving the thought of their heart, took a child, and set him by him, and said unto them, whoever shall receive this child in my name receiveth me: and whoever shall receive me receiveth him that sent me: for he this is least among you all, the same shall be great"

Planting the seeds of God's love in our children's hearts is a great calling. As we share the love of Jesus with the children that God has placed in our lives, let us reflect on the timeless wisdom in Anna Warner's song and remember that we love because he first loved us.
